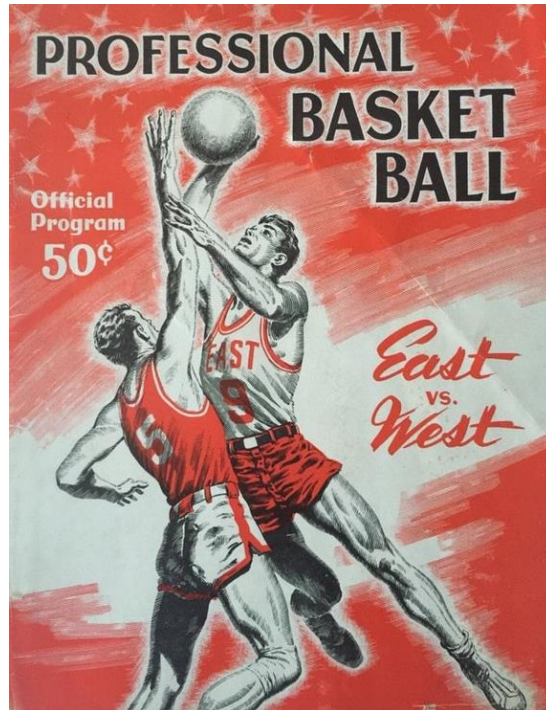


# THE 1958 NBA ALL-STAR TOUR

In 1958 the Boston Celtics and St. Louis Hawks met in the NBA Finals for the second consecutive year. Bill Russell suffered an ankle injury in the third game which forced him to miss the next two contests and affected his play in the sixth and deciding game won by the Hawks on April 12. Boston's initial reign as NBA champions was over. Two days later, two teams of NBA All-Stars began a tour to many of the same sites that the Celtics had visited a year earlier. Charles Caruso again promoted the tour.<sup>1</sup>

Unlike the 1957 tour, players from all eight NBA teams were represented, including 16 of the 20 players who had participated in the NBA All-Star Game in January.<sup>2</sup> Bob Cousy and Bob Pettit were named captains of their respective squads.<sup>3</sup> There were also a few special additions for selected games. Russell’s ankle injury kept him from playing in the first five games of the tour, and he was also delayed due to a break-in at his home in Reading, Massachusetts; fellow Celtic Tom Heinsohn filled in for Russell during this stretch.<sup>4</sup> Halfback R.C. Owens of the NFL’s San Francisco 49ers, who had earned AAU (Basketball) All-American honors in 1957 and was being pursued by the Minneapolis Lakers,<sup>5</sup> played for the West team during their stops at San Francisco and San Jose. And for the game at Louisville on May 1, three Kentucky natives who had played college ball in the state were added to the rosters: Vern Hatton, Frank Ramsey, and Charlie Tyra.<sup>6</sup>

K.C. Jones also joined the tour for 10 games from April 18 through April 27. Jones had been drafted by the Celtics in 1956, but had yet to play for the team due to a commitment to serve in the Army. However, Jones had continued to play basketball. In 1958 he earned AAU All-American honors while leading the Fort Leonard Wood AAU team to a fourth place finish at the annual AAU Tournament, including a 20-point/20-rebound performance in a losing effort in the semifinals.<sup>7</sup> Scheduled to be discharged in August, Jones was granted a 13-day leave to participate with the “College All-Stars” in a game against the Harlem Globetrotters at Boston Garden on April 16 (the All-Stars won 87-77; Jones scored 4 points) and then joined the tour on the road in Eugene, Oregon.<sup>8</sup>

Note: Contemporary wire stories disagree on the number of games on the tour. An article in the *New York Times* on May 5 implies that there was only one game remaining on the tour and that the East led 12-8 at that point; an AP wire service story that appeared in many other newspapers agrees. Other wire service stories state that the series spanned 22 games, not 21, and that the East won the series 13-9. However, I have found

three stories that place a game in Houston on May 3, and articles in the *Miami News* make it clear that the two teams took May 5 and May 6 off before concluding the tour on May 7. The official program for the tour contains a schedule of 21 games but has a few discrepancies: 1) The game in Lincoln, Nebraska, is listed in the program on April 12; 2) The game in Denver is listed on April 13; 3) The game on April 19 was originally scheduled for Portland, Oregon, instead of Vancouver, BC, and 4) The game in Tacoma on April 22 is not listed.
